




Employment status as of December 1, 2019




Location and means of access to the job held



(versus 29% of PhDs working abroad for the EDs belonging to SHS and 28% all EDs combined)







Devenir des docteurs

Professional situation five years after the defense (IPDoc 2019)






Field of activity of the job held



Level of satisfaction



65% think that the doctoral student was a determining factor in obtaining the position they hold (vs. 75% for SHS and 64% all EDs combined)

88% have a job related to their thesis subject (vs. 66% for SHS and 73% all EDs combined)

94% believe that a doctorate is an asset in their professional activity (vs. 86% for SHS and 88% all EDs combined)

88% feel that their job is in line with their skills and level of qualification (vs. 86% for SHS and 78% all EDs combined)

88% feel that their job is in line with their desired level of responsibility (vs. 77% for SHS and 70% all EDs combined)

47% are satisfied with their level of compensation (vs. 54% for SHS and 38% all EDs combined)
